HOME RENOVATION TAX CREDIT (HRTC) - For This Year Only

Now that the warmer weather has arrived, you may be thinking about renovation projects around the house. The good news is that, for this year only, as announced in the 2009 budget, the government has created a tax credit on home renovations. The Home Renovation Tax Credit (HRTC) was implemented as one of the government's initiatives to stimulate economic growth during the recession. Between January 27, 2009 and February 1, 2010, expenditures incurred by Canadian residents for renovating or altering an eligible dwelling, including labour, materials, and associated rentals or permits required for the renovation, may be entitled to the credit. The dwelling must be a personally-owned housing unit of principal residence during the time of the

credit. Land where your house is located may also be eligible for the HRTC, although the amount of land that can be considered as a part of a principal residence is usually limited to half of a hectare. Owned condominiums that are used as principal residences, as well as common areas of the condominiums, are also eligible for the HRTC. The credit offers a 15 per cent tax credit on expenses greater than \$1,000 and capped at \$10,000. This may result in a maximum credit of \$1,350 (or [\$10,000 - \$1,000] X 15% = \$1,350). This credit is considered a "family-based" credit, meaning that only one credit can be claimed between an individual and his / her spouse or common-law partner, including children under the age of 18 years. This credit will be eligible for the 2009 tax year and collectable when you complete your 2009 tax return in 2010. It should be noted that the value of any renovation or alteration work completed by you will not qualify for the HRTC. As well, if goods or services are provided by a friend or relative, that person must be a GST or HST registrant and declare the value as income if the expenditure is to be claimed.

Additional Opportunities Provided -

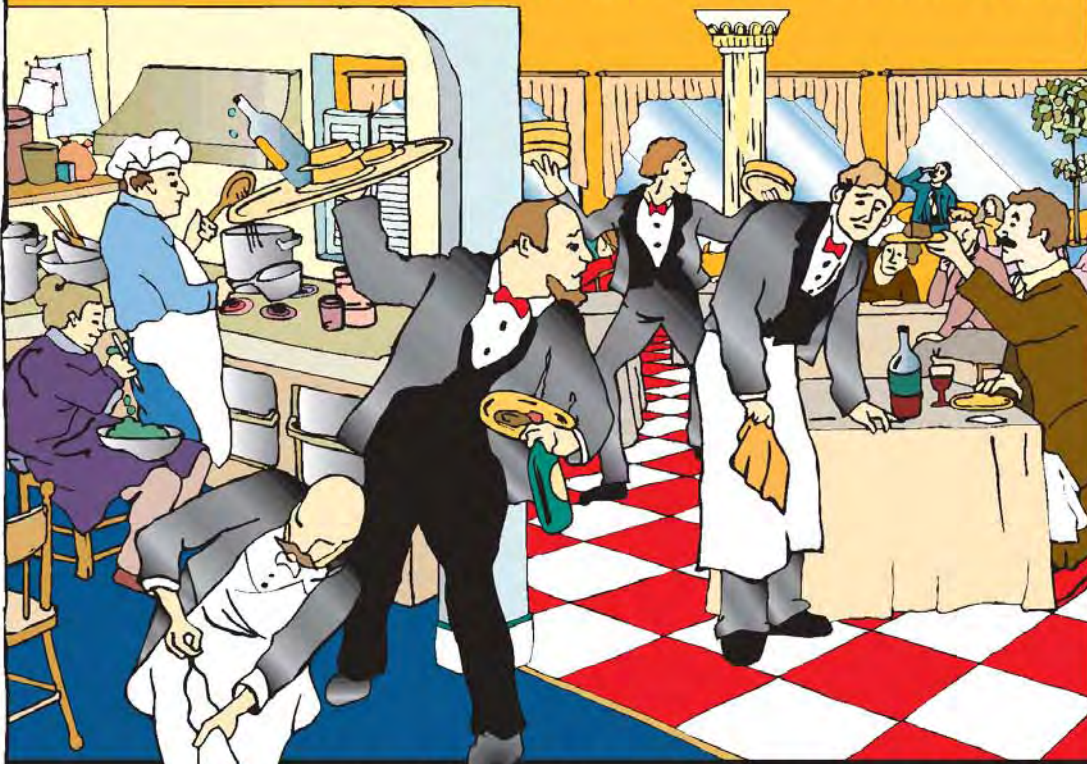
You may be able to claim additional tax credits for those expenditures that are eligible for the HRTC. Consider the following opportunities where you will be able to claim tax credits in addition to the 15% HRTC . **Medical Expense Tax Credit** - Home renovations or alterations may be required to accommodate disabled family members. These expenditures may qualify for both the HRTC and the Medical Expense Tax Credit. **EcoENERGY Grant** -Home renovations or alterations that increase energy efficiency may be eligible for a federal grant of up to \$5,000 per home. This grant is only available once a residential energy efficiency assessment has been conducted on your home. Keep all service agreements and associated receipts to support your claim. Although you will not need to include these in your 2009 tax return, you will need to provide proof if requested in the future by the CRA.

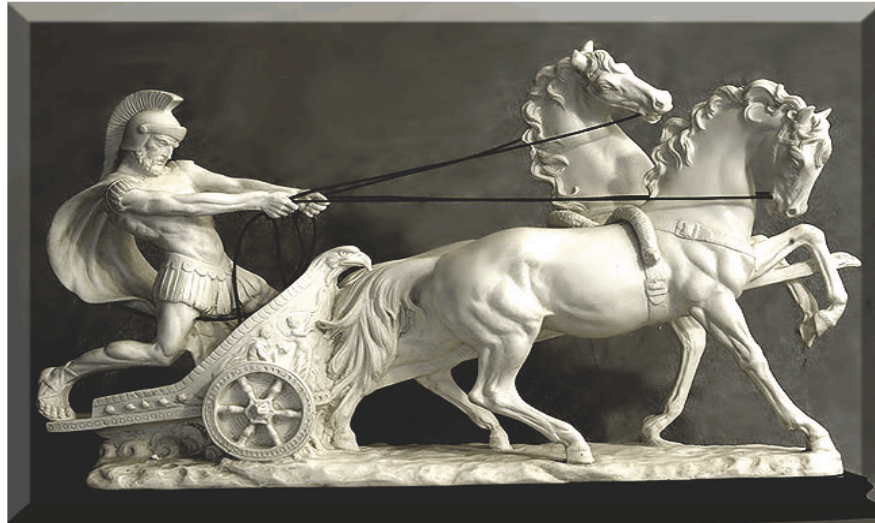

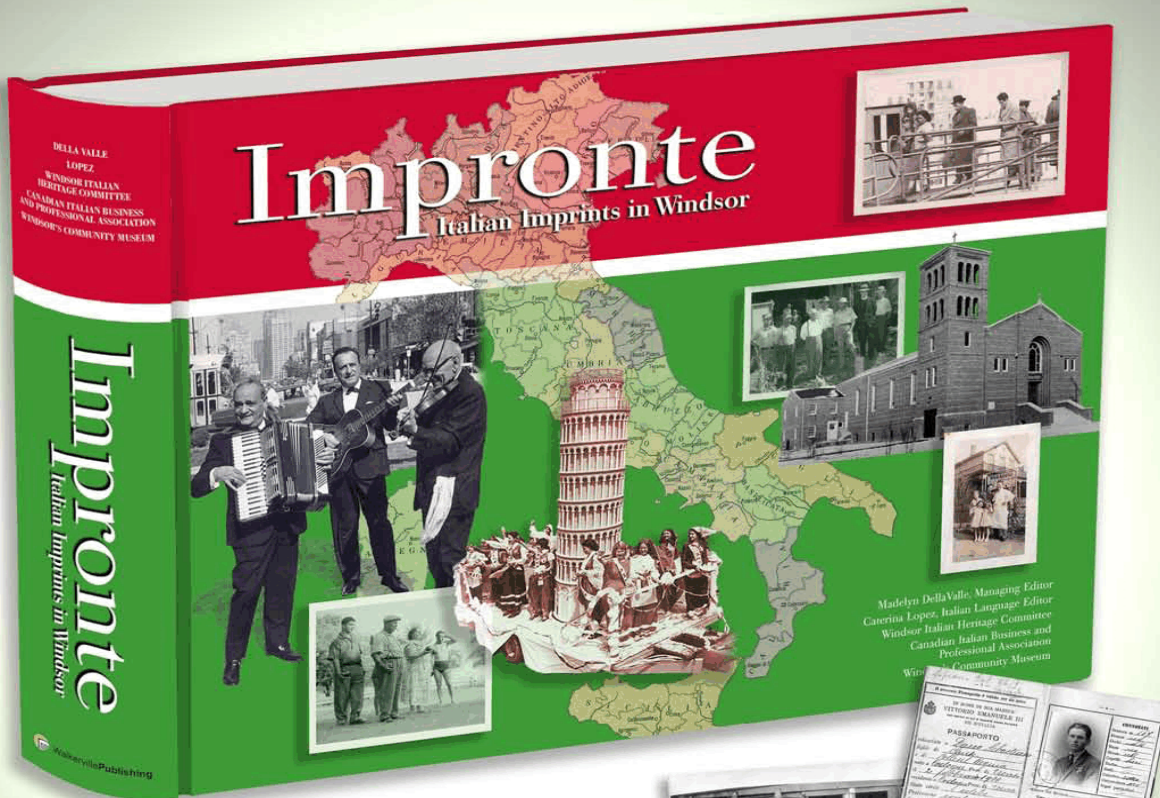
